Through our social work, we are committed to inspire, motivate, empower and to do Action Based Community Development, thus to become a 'Change Agent' to the people whom we serve.

SO THINK POSITIVELY- LIVE JOYFULLY.

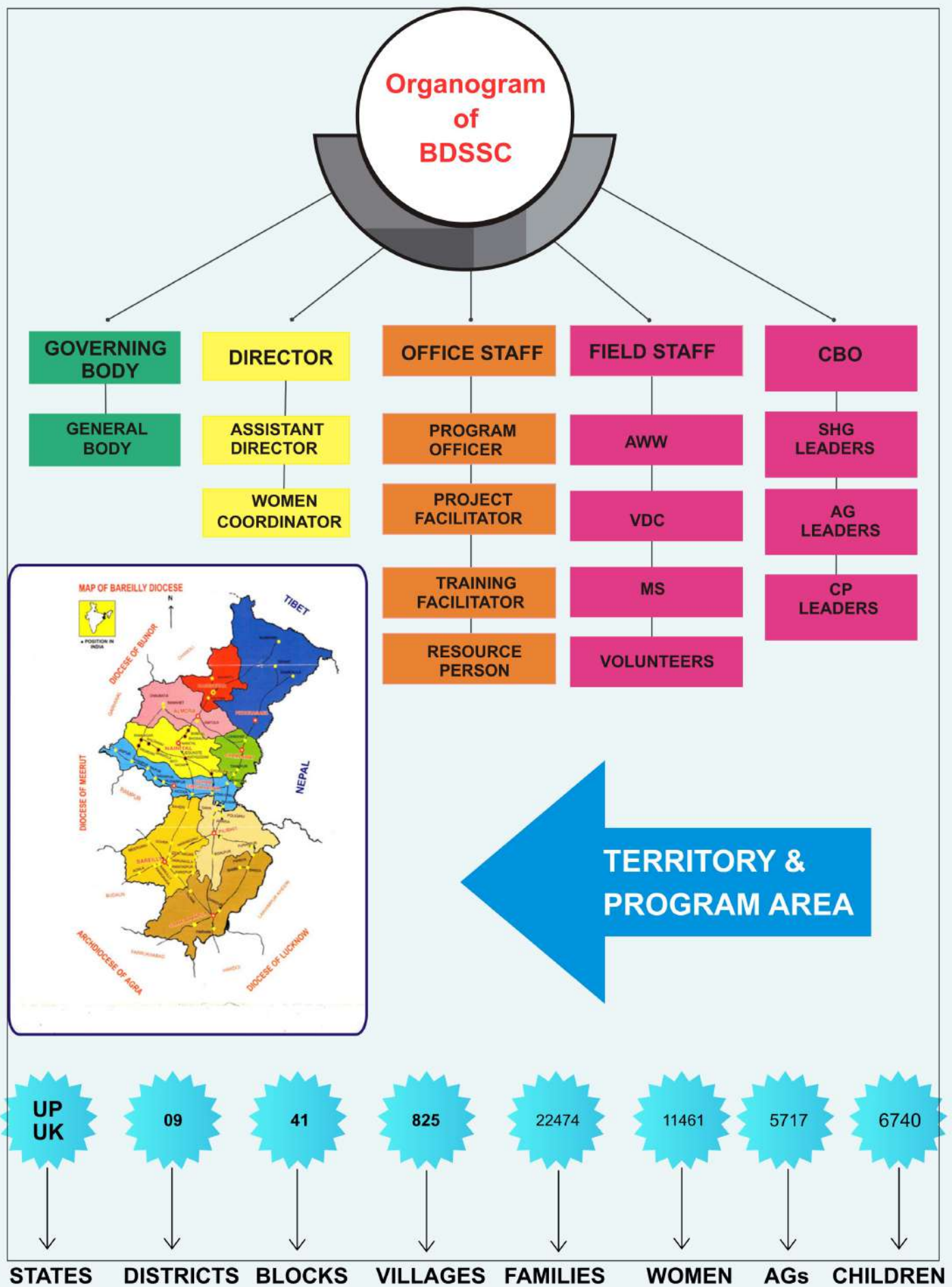

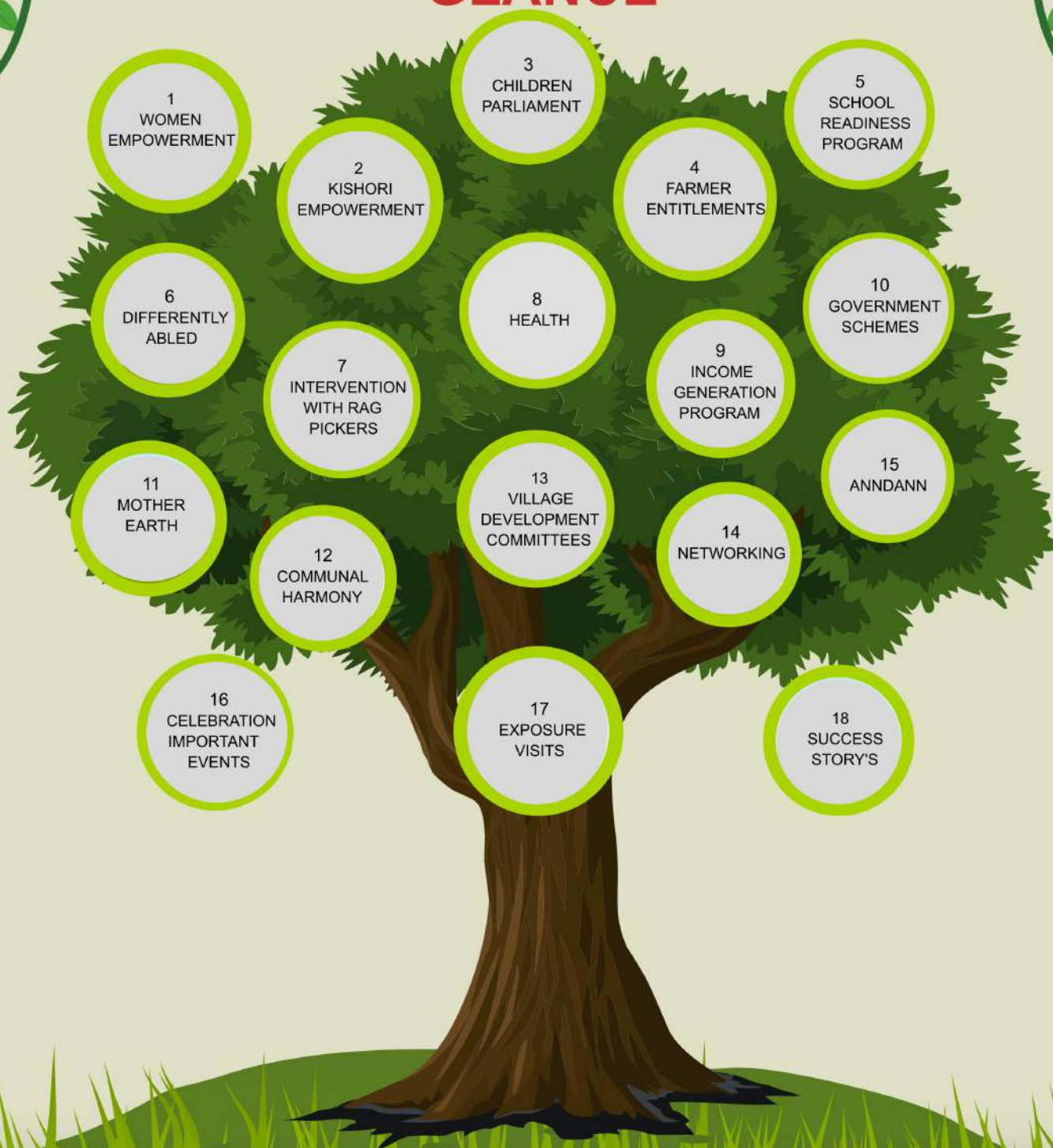

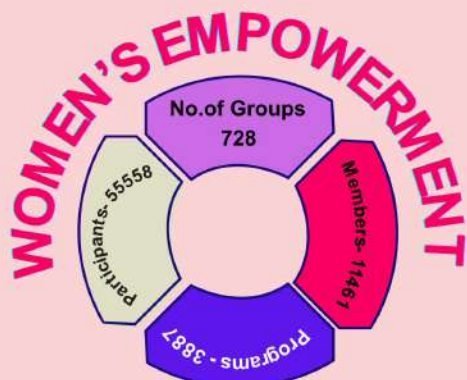
WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Empowerment of women through SHGs and Federation is one of Suchetna's most significant contribution to the communities in which it intervenes. Women benefit not only in terms of capacity building with regard to employable skills but most important through confidence building and having dignified life in their local community. We work on strengthening our Rural Women by empowering them with:

- Personal growth skills (motivation, leadership, team work etc.,)
- Sensitization of their rights, health awareness (encouraging kitchen gardens for herbal and nutrition purposes), hygiene (for self and their family), schemes provided by the government
- Health and Hygiene exhibitions.
- Income generation skills (tailoring and beautician courses)
- Awareness of Domestic Violence and creating space to open up
- Encouraging women to be leaders in their community

Children Parliament

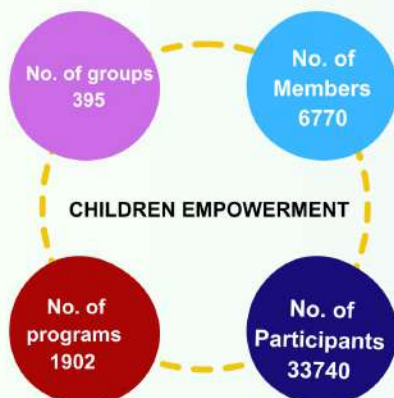

The Children who come together as a group for activities, learning, and to represent their interests and opinions to the decision making for the good of the village. This ensures that children, who remain at the core of all our projects, get a say in matters that affect them directly. A Children's Parliament receives, and is involved in, the following development and training activities:



- Equipping children with the basic concepts of the Children's Parliament
- Providing life skills' education, career guidance and leadership
- Equipping children with the knowledge to maintain sustain ability of the Children's Parliament
- Sensitizing children about child rights and behavioural modification
- Undertaking activities that focus on the children's health and safe environment
- Teaching children the art of negotiation and group decision making



Portfolios are assigned to make the experience realistic. Some of their responsibilities include - planting and protecting plants, cleanliness drive, School chalo rally, save water, electricity and paper, helping the needy and writing applications to the Panchayat office to fulfil the common needs in the villages.

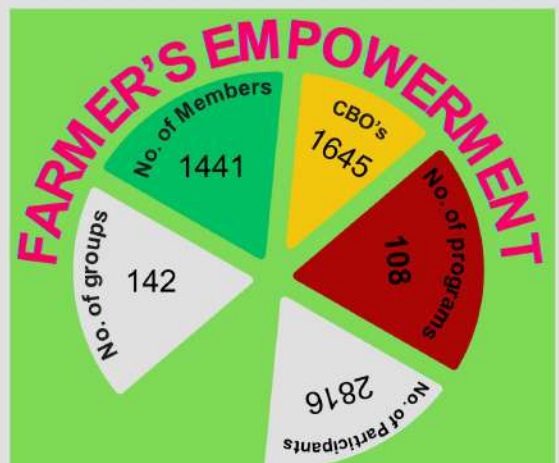


FARMER ENTITLEMENTS

The farmers realized that the traditional farming methods they had inherited were no longer sufficient to provide a stable income for their family. Now they embraced the integrated Farming System (IFS) and reshaped their fortunes and the integration of bio input into their farming system allowed them to make efficient use of organic manure, further enhancing soil fertility.



An Indian Farmer toils tirelessly and faces a lot of hardship to bring food to our tables. The changes in our environment and technology have disrupted the life of a small farmer. Through Saksham and Saffal projects, we at Suchetna, aim at building farmer groups to bridge the knowledge gap. We create awareness on various topics

- Organic Farming.
- Water Conservation.
- Seed Preservation .
- Facilitate networking with KVK.
- Benefits of PRI.
- Integrated Pest Management .
- Integrated Nutrition Management .
- Local farming system.

SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAM

Our School Readiness Program is implemented at the Anganwadi centres (AWC), with the support of Suchetna staff and Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS). Training is given to the Anganwadi Tutors and Helpers. Teaching Learning Materials (TLM) is initiated in all the AWCs and the Anganwadi workers (AWWs) are motivated to prepare and use it for teaching. We strengthen the Mata Samiti members to monitor and support the AWCs.

All the AW tutors are taught 11 steps methodology so that they take much interest in teaching various subjects in a creative way. Master Trainers (MTs) are selected and given special training to teach the 11 step methodology to other AWWs in the other sectors of the block and district. The training is well appreciated and supported by the ICDS officials. Our intervention has helped to increase the attendance of the children and motivated all involved in this program to deliver their best .



SPECIALLY ABLED

Our program assists the Specially abled at our various centres through the support of lillian Fonds and JVS by partially supporting their nutrition, education and medical expenses. Our training gives them insights to deal with their emotional needs and help them to fit in our Society. Family members and Caregivers are motivated to support them through awareness programs and counselling . A total of 300 specially abled children and youngsters are under our care.



INTERVENTION WITH RAGPICKERS



Rajpura and Dholak Basti are very familiar names with the residents of Haldwani. Migrants in these two slums engage in cleaning up the city. Rag pickers are the unofficial garbage cleaners of any city. They sustain themselves by collecting, sorting and segregating waste and then trading it.

"Apna Ghar Siksha Kendra" at Rajpura engages with children and young girls to better their lives. Small children are given early education, which helps them to enrol in government as well as private schools. Nutrition is provided to them daily. At present we have a total of 65 children and 55 AGs in 2 centres.

Two tailoring centres having 3 batches in both slums daily, help our Adolescent girls to learn and hone this skill. They stitch their own clothes and make cloth bags too. Awareness of varied topics like health and hygiene, Self-growth, Leadership skills, Values and Ethics are imparted to them regularly

Cultural programs are arranged for them at Suchetna and at the respective centres on major festivals and important days. We continue to strive to make the WORLD a better place for them.



COMMUNITY HEALTH

A healthy society is a boon. Right from the beginning, Suchetna has been dedicated to Community- based health improvement programs. We are sensitizing community people on seasonal diseases and reproductive health through various types of community health programs and schemes run by the Government. We have introduced the below concepts in all our project centres:

- Health and Hygiene
- Healthy Diet and cooking (Food and Flag)
- Colostrum Feeding
- Preventive measures
- Herbal Garden and kitchen garden (Poshan vatika)
- Home/herbal Remedies
- Health camps, health exhibitions and health Awareness

Empowering our Women community paves the way for stronger educated families. Choices and decisions change when they have their own money. Self Esteem and Confidence help them to nurture their families and children, who turn out to be responsible and caring adults. Our current IGP programs are :

- Candle making

GOVERNMENT SCHEMES

The Government offers schemes for the lesser privileged of the society Our staff at all centers offer awareness programs, workshops and assistance to apply for the schemes. Some of them are mentioned below:



- Widow Pension Scheme (Widows living below poverty Line, aged between 40 to 59 years, are eligible to apply)
- Shadi Anudan Yojana (scheme for the welfare of married women of General, SC/ST category who are below poverty line)
- NalKup Yojna (Assistance to farmers for boring of tube wells)
- PM Awas Yojana (PMAY) (It is an affordable housing scheme which provides monetary assistance to the poor for construction or buying a home)
- Divyang Pension (monetary assistance for the disabled).
- Annapurna Scheme (food security to meet the requirement of those Senior Citizens)
- Shree Shakti Yojana
- Mahila Udyam Nidhi Yojana.

VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (VDC)

Participation, Encouragement and Support is necessary to implement our Projects. Our staff form Village development committee (VDC) or Grameen Sahyog Samitis (GSSs) in all our target villages. It comprises of 7 to 11 influential and interested people from the Village (Pradhan, Panchayat/Ward members, Teachers and Leaders from the Community Based Organizations (CBO). Initial Meetings are conducted to discuss the project activities and get suggestions by the VDC. Subsequently, monthly meetings are conducted to evaluate the ongoing project and its activities. They are ready to contribute much to the implementation of the project activities and to understand the dire need of the villages.



PME AND CAPACITY BUILDING



To enhance growth one needs to monitor and evaluate plans. Periodic PME's (Planning monitoring evaluation) are organised twice a month at the Local level, every quarter at the Zonal level and twice a year at the Centre with the Director and the Women Coordinator. The PME's help us to evaluate progress and give timely correction if and when necessary. An Organization grows when its staff grow individually and holistically. We impart periodic trainings on various topics by trained resources available internally and sourced externally. We focus on Communication Skills, Motivation, Goal setting, Team Work, Strategic Planning, Personality Development, Leadership and Report Writing.



COLLABORATION AND NETWORKING

- > When one is engaged in the Social Sector, we need to work together with many other Organisations to create success stories. From funding to execution many a hand is required. Regular visits with the concerned officials and Organisations help us build a strong network.
- > Suchetna was blessed by the visits of Mrs. Gloria and Mrs. Carmen from Manos Unidas, Spain. They had a meeting with the office staff at Suchetna, and visited Banda, Poliganj, Kichha and Izatnagar centers, where they had meetings with all the project staff and also interacted with SHG women, AGs, CPs, MTs, MSs, GSS, Anganwadi teachers, local leaders and Pradhans.
- > Regular visit from Caritas India, New Delhi, Mr. Neeraj Kerketta and Mr. Animesh William to give training for the project staff and to evaluate the activities of Saksham and Samvaad projects in Amaria and Poliganj centers and also interacted with the beneficiaries in the villages.
- > Visit from UKSVK for evaluate SAFAL project activities at Kailash colony, Amaria.
- > Five MSW students from the Central University of Kerala and one student from Invertase University, Bareilly had one month block placement in various centres of the diocese.
- > Some of our Collaborators are local Organisations, NGO's like 'Go Clean Go Green', NABARD, PHC's, ANM's, Banks, Police Stations, Government and Private Schools, Anganwadi's, National Rural Health Mission, Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Integrated Child Development Scheme etc.



CELEBRATION AND IMPORTANT EVENTS

Some of those moments have been captured for posterity, and to understand the meaning of each celebration. In all celebrations and events, chief guests were invited to the celebration, to impart message to the target groups.



EXPOSURE VISITS



One of the very important aspect of the AGs and CPs programs includes exposure visits covering police stations, post offices, hospitals, banks etc. in order to expose them to the formalities of these various institutions so as to empower them with the knowledge and information to approach any of these independently and with confidence in case of emergencies and to know about various types of functions, roles and work done in the police station, post office and bank and ended with an interactive question-answer session among the police officers, bank managers and the AGs and CPs. 90% of the AGs and CPs who visited these institutions for the first time and they are grateful to Suchetna.



ANNDAAAN/MA KI ROTI



Food is a basic physiological need and we continued this from last year. Fresh, nutritious vegetarian food packets were provided on a daily basis, except Sunday to the poor and needy. Daily wage earners, the Homeless, Beggars, Rag pickers and street children feasted on this daily. It gave us immense joy to feed them.



This program is done at Banda and Izatnagar Centres by SHG women and 5 women from 'Warish' and Surya SHG are involved in preparing noon meal and give for poor people for Rs.10. This program is sponsored by Kherwadi Social Welfare Association- Ma Foundation in Bandra East, Mumbai.



The poor people are very happy to get fresh hot meal for Rs.10. This is done near a Government hospital at Banda and Izatnagar. This has also boosted the morale of the women.



SUCCESS STORIES

NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE

This is a success story of the women from Khaniya village, Chaubattia, Ranikhet. On the occasion of Nanda Mahotsav, Jhoda cultural dance competition was held on the 26th of September, 2023. This message was communicated by the organizing committee to the villagers but the women due to their busy schedule and ASHOJ (Collection of grass for pet animals) could not make time.

The women were motivated and encouraged to participate by our staff. The women had a meeting and agreed to take part in the competition and registered their group (25 women) on the 18 th of September, 2023. They took time out from their very busy schedules and practiced for an hour every day. They presented the dance in their traditional attire.

The group was awarded a Trophy as first prize and Rs.11000 for their performance. This brought glory to Suchetna and the entire village.

Under the Project 'School Readiness Programme' (SRP), Suchetna organized a training for the Master Trainers at Puranpur. Six trainers were selected from centre to be trained on the 11 step Methodology and TLM preparation. This method helps to deliver the Project in a more effective way.

I, Rekha, am very happy and grateful, that I got an opportunity to learn the 11 step Methodology and have become a Master Trainer. I use this method in our centre. I have trained other 18 Anganwadi teachers in this method too. Our CDPO and Supervisor of ICDS programme, were very happy with our way of teaching, preparation of TLM and training other Anganwadi tutors. They have asked us to share the same during our cluster meetings in the future to other tutors.

I assure my whole hearted support in bringing the changes in the curriculum, as well as, in the children's life. Thanks to Suchetna and Manos Unidas for this opportunity.

ALWAYS DO WHAT IS RIGHT

Ujjal Adolescent girl group (AG) members from 'Echoria' village, Kareilly Center, had organized an exposure program on 25th of July 2023 at the Police Station, for 20 AGs. Mr. Aakash Singh (IAS) imparted various information about the functions and activities of a Police Station and the different types of cases they attend to. Among them, one of the important information was about the FIR police help line numbers like 1091, 1291, 181 which can be used for any kind of gender-based violence and abuse or offences which occurred to the women.

Ms Shalini together with the other AGs lodged FIR and used the help line number to report, about the men who were drunk and caused a lot of nuisance in the street lane throughout day and night.

The police responded to the phone call and FIR and came to the location. 4 men were taken into custody for two days. They were warned not to create nuisance in the neighborhood and released. The Villagers were very appreciative of Ms. Shalini and our AGs for taking such an initiative.

This is one of the most inspiring story from Suchetna, where one of our own has become a Village Pradhan.

Smt. Nirmala Devi has been associated with Suchetna since 1 year 6 month She joined us as a SHG and CBO member SAKSHAM project is running in this village since April '22. The Villagers were not very cooperative initially with our staff. Smt. Nirmala Devi, worked hard to gain the confidence of the Villagers and to run this project. Slowly, the Villagers started accepting us and cooperating with us.

The Pradhan of the Village expired and Smt. Nirmala Devi was temporarily appointed as Acting Pradhan by SDM because of her hard work and dedication to the Villagers. She contested for the post later and won by 151 votes against her nearest Opponent. She continues to be associated with us.



FRUITS OF HARD LABOUR

Social work is going on through Suchetna Social Service Sub-centre, Poliganj, due to which the members of Mata Samiti came to know that children aged between 3 to 6 years were not getting the benefit of pre-school education in the Anganwadi of the village. To provide the benefits of education, a meeting was held with the Mata Samiti and GSS members on 10/08/2023 and the people of the village were explained about the education available to children of 3 to 6 years. Then the second meeting was held on 22/08/2023, after which the women got inspired and contacted the Delhi Child Development Project Officer by phone and registered their problems and after this the investigation was done on 30/08/2023.

After which the problem was resolved and Anganwadi worker Kamaljeet Kaur apologized to everyone and promised that the facilities provided by the government will be provided to everyone as per the rules. Today the children of the village are getting the benefits from the Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS).
