ABOUT SUCHETNA SOCIAL SERVICE CENTRE

Suchetna (Bareilly Diocesan Social Service Centre is a registered charitable society, registered under Society Registration Act 1860. It has roots in 3 districts of Uttar Pradesh namely, Bareilly, Pilibhit and Shahjahanpur and in the districts Almora, Bageshwar, Champawat, Nainital, Pithoragarh and Udham Singh Nagar of Uttarakhand state. It has spread its social development activities in 780 villages. The service of Suchetna are made possible through 16 sub centers. Suchetna intervenes in the issues of the target groups (Children, Adolescent Girls, Youth, Women, Men and Children and Youngsters with Disability) of 39 blocks and 19 Nagar Panchayat and bring about social, economic, educational, political and behavioral changes among them.



Women Empowerment

For Suchetna Family, Women's empowerment is to promote women's sense of self-worth, their ability to determine their own choices, and their right to influence social, political, economic and health status and bring change for themselves and in the lives of others.

While strengthening the women groups, Suchetna achieved desired impacts and changes in the lives of women through various awareness programs, constant education, motivation and systematic approaches and actions. This influenced to improve women's access to secure livelihoods and economic resources, alleviate their extreme responsibilities with regard to housework, remove legal impediments to their participation in public life, and raise social awareness through effective programmes of education and mass communication. In addition, improving the status of women also enhances their decisionmaking capacity at all levels in all spheres of life.

To give economic recognition to women, Suchetna motivated them to become self-reliant by training them in various income-generating activities.

Adolescent Empowerment

'Adolescents' specially girls are one of the 'Vulnerable cross sections' in the society: they have their special needs, special challenges and concerns, problems/ difficulties: in terms of health, education, skill development and psycho-social issues. While working with them, Suchetna realized to focus on overall development of their growth and well-being. Our staff have made a lot of efforts and organized various seminars, workshops, awareness programs, games, competitions and rallies to Educate, Engage and Empower the AGs in order to know their rights, develop their talents, increase self -confidence and bring a systematic change in their lives.

Suchetna is pioneering a social revolution in the target villages by encouraging school dropout girls to continue and complete their education through the open schooling (NIOS).

School Readiness Programme

This program positively impacted young children's academic progress and adjustment to the classroom in early grades, as well as increased family involvement in pre-school and primary school. Continued development and expansion of combined with efforts programme, securing sustainability, could make 'Getting Ready for School' a valuable resource for communities that seek to increase early education opportunities for young children.

Suchetna's intervention and achievements on Early Childhood Education and School Readiness in seven of our centres are trying this model and it is working very effectively. It has made great strides in preschool education over the past 3 years in our centres most notably in increasing access, enrolment and providing learning opportunities to children of 3-6 years in pre-schools – Anganwadi Centres (AWCs) and ensuring Good Health in the future by providing nutritious food at the early age.





The Anganwadis teachers and helpers are trained in 11 steps Methodology and to make their Teaching Learning Material more interesting. Strengthening of Mata Samitis help in innovative and creative teaching in these centres and motivate parents so that the children would attend the regular classes at AWC. Due to lockdown, the Anganwadis centres were closed for few months and now it has been re-opened and progressing steadily.

A New Earth-Home-Our Responsibility

Mahatma Gandhi said, "Earth provides enough to satisfy every man's needs, but not every man's greed." There are many small steps we can take to save the planet. When every person starts talking about an action to save the Earth, there will be a difference. The first way you can keep the ground is by planting saplings.

Suchetna has initiated and motivated POs, Women groups, AGs and Children to take care of the nature and their responsibility towards cognitive ability and understanding of nature obliges to maintain the integrity of the environment and they learnt to respect the natural order of things and find a way to live accordingly. Suchetna has Motivated people in our target areas to plant more saplings in their surroundings. A total of 25,868 saplings were planted during the year and 17,395 are surviving.

Hand in hand with 'Go Clean and Go Green' NGO, Suchetna has initiated Mission 'O' Plastic to lighten the Mother Earth from the burden of plastic curse. From the month of Feb. 2021, 'Environment Ambulance' is collecting all type of plastic from over 3000 families in Haldwani town, which is sent to the Recyclers. Children from 20 schools in Haldwani are motivated to become 'Environment Soldiers' to keep the surroundings clean, say no or reduce use of plastic and segragate the waste at home.

Rag Picking Children and Girls

Suchetna has separate Formal and Non- Formal education program for the Rag Picking Children and Girls at Apna Ghar Shiksha Kendra in Haldwani- Rajpura and Gafoor Basti. During the year 2020-21, a total of 70 children got basic education, 15 girls and 55 children received non- formal education and 56 Adolescent girls learned tailoring course. At present 13 girls from Gafoor Basti are attending tailoring class at Suchetna and 15 girls at Apna Ghar Shiksha Kendra. Suchetna continues the awareness programs in these slums on health and hygiene, environment, education, personality development, moral values and behaviour modification, Covid Response, nutrition supply.









Inclusive Development of Children and Youngsters with Disability

It has been a long standing dream and joy of Suchetna to embrace and support the differently abled in all our project areas and to give the hope of a new life. The unwanted and deprived children and youth need care, concern and support from others to lead a normal and meaningful life. Taking into consideration, Suchetna is able to support 114 youth and children in the year of 2020-21 through various awareness programs on health and nutrition, education, medication and skill trainings.

Covid-19 Response

In the Pandemic times, Suchetna has exhibited the true attributes of service by serving the community with love, compassion and empathy. Even in these difficult times, our staff have staved informed, connected committed and found a way to provide hope to the people by reaching out with essential relief services. Manos Unidas, Caritas India, CRS, CBCI- Migrant Commission and Jan Vikas Samiti and local donors have shown their generosity towards the needy and we believed in our human resources as an important pillar of its Strategy.

Suchetna staff took much efforts in creating awareness on Covid, best practices, preparation of homemade hand wash, sanitizers, dish wash, Government guidelines, health and nutrition and importance of vaccination.





As a result, 74 % of the people in the target villages have access to vaccination. The pandemic is far from over, and they are our best bet of staying safe.

Also, it is heart-touching to see how the entire team at Suchetna stood in solidarity with the community risking their lives to surpass the situation. Thus, the Pandemic has now acquainted us with the experience of uncertainties, fear and restrictions both at the individual and community level.

89% people with one dose and 74% people have been fully vaccinated with both doses in the target area.

During the year we have conducted 1615 awareness trainings on Covid-19 Pandemic with 21674 people benefitting.

Suchetna organized 217 health camps that enabled 8,060 people benefit from medical assistance in the diagnosis and treatment of disease.
