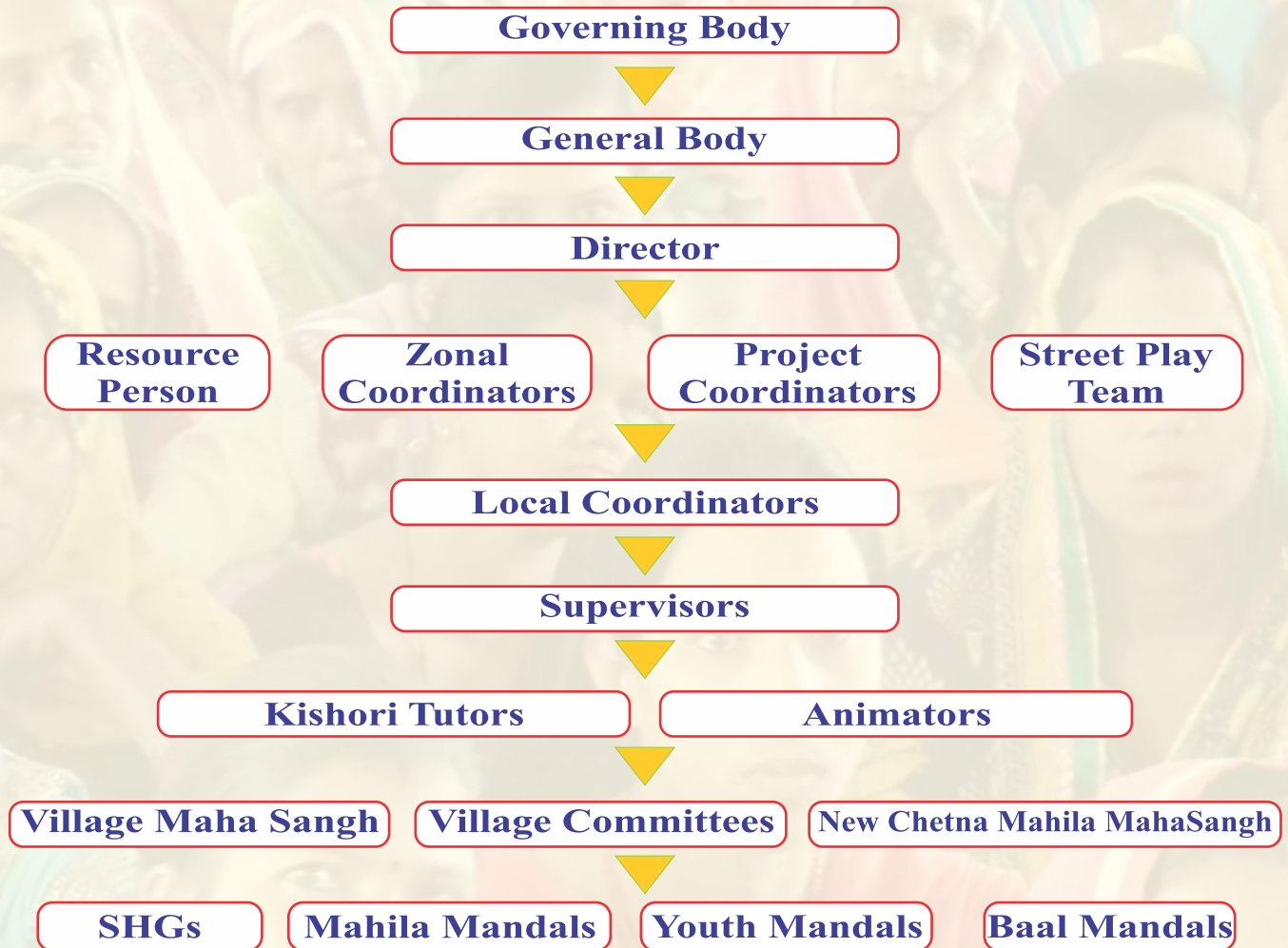

It has roots in 3 districts of Uttar Pradesh namely, Bareilly, Pilibhit and Shahjahanpur and in the districts Almora, Bageshwar, Champawat, Nainital, Pithoragarh and Udham Singh Nagar of Uttarakhand state. It has spread its social development activities in 815 villages. The services of Suchetna are made possible through 22 sub centres. Suchetna intervenes in the issues of the target groups (Children, Adolescent Girls, Youth, Women, Men and Children and Youngster with Disability) of 39 block and 19 Nagar Panchayats and brings about social, economical, educational, political and behavioral changes among them.

## USE THE SUN. BECAUSE HE IS FREE



Solar energy is a resource that is not only sustainable for energy consumption; it is indefinitely renewable. Solar power can be used to generate electricity; it is also used in relatively simple technology to heat water (solar water heaters). The use of skylights in home construction can also greatly reduce energy expenditure required to light rooms in a home's interior during the day.

Since a lot of electricity is being used for running all the programmes/ activities (internal and external) at BDSSC building. There is often Electric Power cut for long period of time which disturbs ongoing programmes in the Centre. During power cut the generator consumes a lot of diesel. Therefore in order to reduce the expenses on fossil fuel and electricity of Suchetna Centre, to make its surroundings eco-friendly and to provide better stay facilities for the inmates and all who come for various purposes to this centre Suchetna got installed solar power light system.

This requirement was fulfilled by the generous support of LOYOLA Foundation

We are ever very grateful to you the President and team at Loyola Foundation towards your generous monetary support and guidance.

Solar panels also require little maintenance. After installation and optimization they are very reliable due to the fact that they actively create electricity. It is a way of harnessing the natural resources to build up energy with a clean and dependable source of power. A onetime investment for a life time benefit with minimum maintenance cost is the importance of this scheme.

Hence we requested MISSIO, Germany to help us with the necessary support to install Solar Power water Heater at 3 hostels in our project areas, where a lot of electric power cut and scarcity of fuels for heating water especially in winter. At present the students in these hostels at Amaria, Dhamola and Poliganj. A total of 315 Students, 23 staff and 15 Domestic helpers happily make use of the hot water facilities availed through the Solar Water Heating System. They are very grateful to MISSIO and all the donors and supporting personnel.



## AONLA: PROMOTING CBOS AND SHGS & BUILDING COMMUNITIES

Aonla has largely an agricultural based economy. Strengthening the CBOs and SHGs has always been one of the top priorities of Suchetna. Sister Vimla as a Coordinator and her Animators have been tirelessly working to form these groups by contacting various groups of people in different villages. The animators have been given regular training and are helped to build up CBOs. Details of their efforts are given below:

Sisters of Ursuline of St. Francis have been rendering their services in Baheri since 2001. The centre has been addressing the socio&economic concerns of people in and around. At present Sr. Sujata and her animators are working for NABARD project. 97 SHGs are active during the year which enabled to meet their survival needs, the creation of grass root leadership and the linkage with various Government Departments.

## BANDA : TAPPING THE GOVERNMENT RESOURCES

Banda is a Town in Banda Block in Shahjahanpur District. One of the dark area of development in Banda block is poor literacy. Farming and daily labour are the main sources of livelihood.

Franciscan Servants of Mary Sisters Started the community development program in February 2004.

Sr. Fuljencia along with her animator is rendering her service in 10 villages. Especially to encourage and empower the women and girls to be self-dependent. Through our continuous guidance women have become familiar with Block, Bank, ATM etc. 21 adolescent girls from different villages are doing vocational training like tailoring, computer and beautician course along with their studies. 19 School dropout girls have taken admission in Kasturba School and 25 dropout children are once again continuing their school studies. Women and girls have started tailoring centres. They have tied up with government school to stitch the uniform and 22 women are involved in CHC canteen. Today people are aware of government schemes like Sanitation Scheme, Housing Scheme, Pension Schemes and Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana Scheme.

Presently, Enhance Better Health, Higher Education and Raised Economic Status for Women and Adolescent Girls programme is aiming at providing technical, digital, skill training and life skills to make them economically empowered. Sr. Litty Rose as a Coordinator is rendering her service in Chaubattia.

Bazpur is well connected with the industrial city of Rudrapur and the historical city of Kashipur. It was initially, like most of the area which forms present day Udham Singh Nagar District, a part of the Terai, and was gradually transformed into arable land by migrants from Punjab.

At present Bazpur sub centre is working on Empower Women for Economic Opportunities Programme under the guidance of Sr.Sunita and with her Animators in 15 villages. She is also looking after the project Inclusive Development of Children and Youngsters with Disability funded directly by Jan Vikas Samiti, Varanasi. The centre is focusing more on women, adolescent girls and children by providing skill training, education, job related trainings, entrepreneurship opportunities in the villages.

They have become means of empowerment to women, they fight for their rights and obtain their due. At present Suchetna is working on NABARD project and Izatnagar sub centre. The programme aims that, women lead a dignified life with better health and economic freedom. Sr. Albeena along with her animators is working on this programme.

## EDUCATION IS A WAY TO UNLIMITED LEARNING IN NAUSAR, AMARIA AND HALDWANI

Education is the most important aspect in the overall development of the human being. Suchetna is pioneering a social revolution in the villages by encouraging adolescent school drop-out girls to continue and complete their education through Adolescent Empowerment Centre. Awareness sessions on current social realities as well as livelihood skills are imparted. Art, music and dance are also an integral part of the curriculum.

We have 3 residential Centres for the drop&out girls who have discontinued their studies due to lack of resources or due to the social reasons.

AshadeepAmaria Empowerment Centre welcomed 18 girl children from adjacent villages to continue their education in 8th class for the academic year 2017-18.

The Empowerment Centre Nausar enrolled 25 girl children from nearby villages to pursue their education in 6th- 7th classes for the academic year 2017-18.

The centre arranged to send all the children daily to the Government school – Pre Intermediate School.

Suchetna has an education centre called APNA GHAR SHIKSHA KENDRA in Haldwani. The tutor in the center, Mrs. Meena visited the families in Gafoor Basti, Rag picker's colony. She motivated parents to send their children to the study center so that they will not waste their childhood in picking rags and roaming around. The parents understood the importance of education and began to send their children to the study center. A total of 44 are admitted to the study center for the current year.





## NAUSAR: EMPOWERMENT FOR A STRONG WOMAN WHO WANT TO EMBRACE LIFE

Enhance Better Health, Higher Education and Raised Economic Status for Women and Adolescent Girls programme is at work in Nausar, a remote village of Khatima block in U.S. Nagar district. The project covers 15 target villages. Suchetna has always been taken deep interest and makes effort to creat awareness among women and adolescent girls. They are motivated to strive for change, individually and collectively for their good health, education and economic independency.

## MOTINAGAR: STRENGTHENING ADOLESCENT GIRLS' KNOWLEDGE, WOMEN'S RIGHTS, HEALTH AND INCOME (SAKHI)



In the rural areas educating the girl child is not considered to be important because she has to remain inside the house to do the household works. Empowerment of adolescent girls in every aspect is possible by gaining knowledge, good health, self confidence and becoming self dependent. To achieve this goal of empowering girls, Suchetna with the collaboration of UKSVK is running SAKHI programme. This project is implemented in 10 villages of Motinagar sub center, Haldwani block, Nainital district. Suchetna is committed to ensure skill development to obtain their rights, enjoy better health and every adolescent girl become a Role model in the society.

- ▶ 79 meetings were held with 1066 adolescent girls participated.
- ▶ 100 home visits were conducted for counseling adolescent girls and their parents against early child marriage and 80 counseling were held on education and health under the Objective of decreasing the number of girls who marry or give birth before the age of 18.
- ▶ Networking and lobbying meetings organized with 10 the Govt. authorities to prevent child marriages.
- ▶ 20 counseling sessions/home visits conducted on family planning.
- ▶ 3 group counseling sessions were held for 48 adolescent girls and these girls took decisions not to marry before the age of 18.
- ▶ 4 times Sex education (knowing our body, menstrual system and hygiene) were held for 148 girls. And all girls took the decision to impart their knowledge with other girls.
- ▶ One session on food and flag was held in which 33 girls participated and 20 kitchen gardens were prepared.
- ▶ 57 girls and adolescent were thought on Healthy cooking.
- ▶ There was one sessions on Swasth Kishori Pratiyogita Celebrating World Health and the number of participant were 51.



## INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT OF CHILDREN AND YOUNGSTERS WITH DISABILITY

Suchetna is engaged in the noble service of bringing a stable change in the lives of Children and Youngsters with Disability, with the collaboration of Jan Vikas Samiti, Varanasi. It's a social inclusive development programme which renders aid and appliances, health care, education and psychological support to the children and youngsters with disability. Currently 101 children and youngsters are benefitting from this project. Out of these 47 are doing their studies in government and private schools. There are 42 children and youngsters under medical care. 13 of them receive epilepsy medicine, 20 children receive nutrition supplements and 9 beneficiaries are provided with physiotherapy. Two youngsters are attending Bachelor of Technology course in Bareilly district. 7 youngsters are contributing to their family income through various income generating activities. Rest of the 5 youngsters cooperate with the household activities at their home. All these children and youngsters are motivating and supporting other person with disability, in the community.





## EMPOWERMENT OF ADOLESCENT GIRLS THROUGH RESIDENTIAL CENTRES



To rectify the traditional Gender imbalance which discriminates against women and girls Suchetna organizes Residential and Non-Residential Kishori Empowerment Centers that enroll adolescent girls who are school drop&out to continue and complete their education up to Class XII under National Institute of Open Schooling(NIOS), at Suchetna, Kathgodam.

For the current year 20 adolescent girls have been enrolled for Class 10th and 18 girls for Class 12th.





## RUDRAPUR: ENHANCE BETTER HEALTH, HIGHER EDUCATION AND RAISED ECONOMIC STATUS FOR WOMEN AND ADOLESCENT GIRLS



Interdependence is indispensable for effective functioning. Suchetna has thus forged valuable networks with other GOs and NGOs. This has helped Suchetna staff to Enhance Better Health, Higher Education And Raised Economic Status For Women And Adolescent Girls. Mrs. Sapna rendering her service as a coordinator for the project.

## AMARIA: WE ARE READY FOR LITTLE KIDS WITH BIG DREAMS

One of the projects is “School Readiness Programme” under the guidance of Sr. Brita. In this project Suchetna prepares children aged between 3 to 5 years for school readiness and to transit from pre-school to formal education systems in Amaria Block.

Scenario at glance

- ▶ 16 meetings with Gram Pradhans were held in order to explain to them about our Project and its Goal and Objectives. We made them realise the benefits the Children of the age group 3-5 will have through the Integrated Child Development Services.
- ▶ Selection of Resource group/Master Trainer was done. 4 trainings were conducted for this Resource Group/ Master Trainers. After which we started selecting Master Trainers from among the Anganwadi Workers. So far we have selected 6 master trainers.
- ▶ 2 Trainings were conducted on 11 steps methodology for 2 days. 9 staff participated in this program. Mr. Salahudin and Ms. Shardha were the resource persons.
- ▶ 4 Master trainers have imparted 4 trainings to 70 Anganwadi Workers and 10 Resource Group Members.
- ▶ After These trainings 26 Anganwadi Workers have implemented these 11 Steps methodology in their own respective Anganwadi Centers.
- ▶ 36 Anganwadi Workers have been given training on 11 steps to 70 Anganwadi Workers and now 70 Anganwadi Workers are following up the activities in their own Anganwadi Centers.
- ▶ 1597 children have attended these classes. 40% attendance has increased in Anganwadi Centers.





## KAREILLY DSS: I CAN AND I WILL

Suchetna is committed to ensure the Empowerment and Livelihood Facilitation for adolescent girls and young women to prevent them from human trafficking. Vocational training was imparted at DSS Centre level and replicated at local level. Sr. Regis along with her Facilitators is working on this programme.

## PARTASPUR, BAREILLY : EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN AND YOUTH AT GRASS ROOT LEVEL IN RURAL AREAS

Through the project, Premanjali Mahila Vikas Kendra mainly focuses on creating more awareness and gives them the right information to benefit from the various Government Schemes. Coordinator Sr. Saroj along with her facilitators is working in 35 villages. The facilitators motivate women and girls to be more assertive and to be united to stand against all types of atrocities. Thus to get a better status and dignity for them.

Trainings were given to Women forum and Self Help Groups on Rights of Women, Dowry System and Health of Women. Awareness sessions were held for women and young girls on various atrocities done against them and various Acts and legal aid related to it. These women began decision making and they pressurize the local government to have better development in their village.

The centre has 116 self-help groups. These groups are given training on food processing, bag making, tailoring and candle making. 40% of these women are engaged in marketing chilly, turmeric and coriander powder and they earn Rs. 5000 - 6000/- per month.

45% families of the target groups benefitted from various Government Schemes such as Ujjwala Gas Scheme, Sanitation Scheme, various pensions Scheme.

The centre has formed health committees in the villages which monitor the health situation of the villages. The committees are active and alert to provide health care for the needy villagers.





## MEERGANJ: WOMEN ARE TURNING OUT TO BE OUR GREATEST INNOVATORS



Sr. Alphy and her motivators are working on Rehabilitation of Girls from Human Trafficking programme in Meerganj.

The centre focuses more on skill training and promoting higher studies for adolescent girls. Skill training specially tailoring and basic computer support them to attain some job and earn their livelihood.



Women and girls are given training on stitching various cloths according to the current fashion, bag making, crafts, artificial flower bouquets, garlands and embroidery. 50% of the trained young women and girls are earning by stitching and embroidery and various craft works around Rs. 6000/- to 7000/- per month.



- ▶ 40 trainings on Leadership, Human Rights and Value Education were held and 832 adolescent girls took part in the training.
- ▶ 22 trainings on bag making, candle making, dona paper plate and detergent making. 604 women and adolescent have participated.
- ▶ 53 girls joined for tailoring course and they learned basic of tailoring.
- ▶ 63 girls completed X & XII classes through NIOS.
- ▶ Environment day, Independence day, Adolescent day, Women's day, Teacher's day, Gandhi Jayanti, Rakshabandhan festival were celebrated with community.
- ▶ Govt. Schemes: 266 toilets are made under sanitation scheme. 12 persons were availed with PF scheme, 11 housing scheme applications are submitted, 3 persons got ration card and 9 old age pensions.
